By means of this writ petition under Articles 226/227 Constitution of India, petitioners have prayed for issuance of directions to respondent Nos.1 to 3 to protect their life and liberty as they are facing threats at the hands of respondent Nos.4 to 7.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that petitioner No.1 is minor whereas petitioner No.2 is major and both are residing together. It is further contended that there is threat to petitioner No.1 from the private respondents (parents of petitioner No.1) as they are compelling her to marry with some other person against her wishes, therefore, petitioners ran away from their respective house on 07.01.2021 and now living together. A representation dated 07.01.2021 (Annexure P-3) has been submitted to Commissioner of Police, Amritsar by the petitioners, but no action has been taken so far.

After hearing the learned counsel for the petitioner, this Court

finds that the petitioner No.1 has not attained the age of majority and on her behalf the affidavit has been filed by her friend (petitioner No.2) who cannot act as guardian of petitioner No.1. A perusal of the representation further reveals that the petitioners are known to each other for a long time and the alleged apprehension of threat expressed in the representation is not supported by any material, much less with the relevant particulars.

Resultantly, this Court does not find it to be a fit case for exercise of extra ordinary writ jurisdiction only on the basis of bald averments made in the petition.

Dismissed.
