Prayer in both these petitions filed under Section 439(2) Cr.P.C. is for cancellation of anticipatory bail. In CRM-M-2337-2019, petitioner is seeking cancellation of anticipatory bail allowed to respondents No.2 and 3 whereas in CRM-M-2340-2019, she is seeking cancellation of anticipatory bail allowed to respondent No.2 in case FIR No.28, dated 19.03.2018, under Sections 406, 498-A, 120-B IPC, Police Station Women Cell, Ludhiana.

Mr. Nikhil Vats, Legal Aid Counsel, appointed for the petitioner-Daljeet Kaur, files his power of attorney in both the cases. Same are taken on record. It is contended that during the pendency of proceedings in the High Court, the matter stands compromised between the parties as would be evident from the affidavits furnished by the petitioner. Counsel would pray for the said affidavits to be taken on the record.

The affidavits filed on behalf of the petitioner in both the cases are taken on record.

At this stage, appearance has been caused by Mr. Manpreet Singh, Advocate, on behalf of private respondents in both the petitions, who affirms the compromise having been effected between the parties.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner and have also perused the two affidavits filed wherein the petitioner herein has categorically submitted that she does not press the instant petitions for cancellation of bail as the matter under the said FIR arising under Sections 406, 498-A, 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station Women Cell, Ludhiana already stands compromised.

Consequently, as the petitioner does not press the instant petitions, the same stand disposed of.
