MANJARI NEHRU KAUL, J. (ORAL)

The present petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.181 dated 01.11.2019 under Sections 307, 458, 354, 323, 427, 148 and 149 IPC and Sections 25 and 27 of the Arms Act, 1959 registered at Police Station Ajnala, District Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that in compliance of order dated 22.01.2020/09.08.2021, the petitioner has joined investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Baljit Singh, has apprised the Court that the petitioner has no doubt joined investigation in compliance of order dated 22.01.2020/09.08.2021, however, she submits that the petitioner had fired upon injured Kala Singh with a fire arm as a result of which the latter received injuries on the right side of his chest, which is a vital part of his body. She has

opposed the prayer of the counsel opposite by submitting that custodial interrogation of the petitioner would be required in the case in hand in the wake of the serious allegations levelled and the specific role attributed to the petitioner in the crime in question.

Prima facie the allegations against the petitioner are serious and the injury suffered by the injured Kala Singh at the hands of the petitioner was opined to be dangerous to life.

In the facts and circumstances as enumerated hereinabove, this Court does not deem it fit to extend the extraordinary concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Dismissed.
