The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

The petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.329 dated 25.12.2020 registered under Sections 323, 452, 506, 148 and 149 IPC at Police Station Chhappar, District Yamuna Nagar.

On 29.01.2021, following order was passed:-

“The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the only non-bailable offence is under Section 452 IPC. Suit for possession filed by father of the petitioner in respect of house in question was decreed against the complainant party by the Civil Court vide judgment and decree dated 27.04.2015.

The complainant party remained unsuccessful in first appeal before the Additional District Judge, Yamuna Nagar at Jagadhri and the same was dismissed on 10.07.2018. Even RSA No.7063 of 2018 was dismissed by the High Court on 14.05.2019. In execution of the civil court decree, possession of the property in question was delivered to father of the petitioner on 09.07.2019 and a report to that effect was made by the Bailiff.

In the meanwhile, petitioner is directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer to join investigation on 04.02.2021 at 11.00 A.M. and in the event of his arrest, he shall be enlarged on ad interim bail, on his furnishing requisite bail bonds/surety bonds subject to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance of the aforesaid order, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Randhir Singh admits the aforesaid fact. Learned State counsel further states that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is no more required for further investigation in the case.

In view of the above, the order dated 29.01.2021 is made absolute. Petitioner shall keep on joining the investigation as and when required to do so and he shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands disposed of.
