This petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.328 dated 11.12.2019 under Sections 420, 465, 466, 467, 468 & 471 Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Civil Lines, Amritsar District Amritsar. The petitioner apprehended her arrest at the hands of Police, in the above FIR.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has invited the attention of the Court to the order dated 29.01.2020, whereby while issuing notice of motion to respondent-State, the interim protection was extended to the petitioner. The said order reads as under:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the FIR is founded on vague complaint given by the complainant, namely, Jasbir Singh, who is neighbour of the petitioner and implicated her on the

allegation of furnishing fake sureties before the Court. Learned counsel contends that no particulars were given in the said complaint. He further contends that the petitioner never stood surety in any case and the complainant has falsely indicted the petitioner, who is ready to join the investigation.

Notice of motion for 20.05.2020.

Meanwhile, the petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when called for and in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be admitted to interim bail on her furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner further contends that in deference to the said order, the petitioner submitted herself before the Police and joined the investigation. According to him, the petitioner cooperated with the Police Authorities during the investigation and furnished requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the Investigating Officer/Arresting Officer.

Learned State counsel who is assisted by ASI Heera Singh does not dispute this fact that the petitioner has joined the investigation and she is not required for custodial interrogation for the time being.

Considering the above, the petition is allowed and the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 29.01.2020 is made absolute.
