Case taken up through video conferencing.

The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 0591 dated 02.12.2020, under Sections 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Sector 5, Panchkula, District Panchkula.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that he wants to withdraw this petition qua petitioner No.1.

The petition is dismissed as withdrawn qua petitioner No.1.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that it is alleged in the FIR that petitioner No.1 had pledged the property for obtaining loan from the bank. He also contends that the petitioners were joint owners of 13 'bigas' of land and the share of the petitioners was 400 sq. yards. The land is situated within the municipal limits of Pinjore and the value was also assessed by the approved valuer of the bank and the loan had been sanctioned by the Bank Manager. He also contends that petitioner No. 2 has been roped in the case, as

she is the wife of petitioner No. 1 while petitioner No. 3, who is 68 years of age, is the father of petitioner No. 1. The allegations are primarily against petitioner No.1.

This Court, by the order dated 12.02.2021, had directed petitioners No.2 and 3 to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of their arrest, they were ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Pritam Singh, states that the petitioners No.2 and 3 have joined investigation.

In view of the above and petitioners No.2 and 3 having joined investigation, the order dated 12.02.2021 granting interim bail to petitioner No.2 and 3 is made absolute.

However, petitioner No.2 and 3 shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
