1 By this petition the petitioner has challenged the non-release
of his goods by claiming that he had paid the applicable duty.

2 On the other hand the stand of the counsel for respondent
No.1 is that these goods are liable to be confiscated. He has further
stated that the petitioner has been given a show cause notice and if he
appears the competent authority shall consider all the objections
regarding not only whether the goods are liable to confiscation but
whether, as claimed by the petitioner, due duty has already been paid by
them.

3 Counsel for the petitioner states that it would be appropriate
if the matter is decided by the Commissioner-respondent No.1 himself.

4 Counsel for respondent No.1 has very fairly stated that this
adjudication will be done by the Commissioner and further states that
after the petitioner appears, the final decision shall be taken within three
days.

5 Counsel for the petitioner states that he would appear before
respondent No.1 on 22.03.2021 and will address the issue.

6 In view of the statement of both the parties the petition
stands disposed of.

7 Petition stands disposed of with the above terms.

8 Since the main case has been decided, the pending Misc.
Application, if any, also stands disposed of.
