Through the instant petition under Section 438 of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, the petitioners seek anticipatory bail in case FIR No.04 dated 15.01.2020, Annexure P-1, registered under Sections 452, 323, 148, 149 and 506 of IPC, 1860, at Police Station Nihal Singh Wala, District Moga.

Counsel for the petitioners submits that the dispute between the parties has now been settled and a compromise has been arrived at, on the basis of which a petition (CRM-M-8856-2020) has been filed for quashing of the FIR, in which this Court has directed the parties to get their statements recorded in support of the compromise.

Vide order dated 30.01.2020, while granting interim protection to the petitioners, this Court passed the following order:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that on 13.01.2020, a cross-fight took place and it was the complainant, who was the aggressors. He has further submitted that petitioner No.1-Harminder Singh @ Harwinder Singh, had suffered injuries in the attack and was admitted in the hospital. MLR was prepared which shows grievous injuries on the face of petitioner No.1 but the police did not register FIR on the statement of petitioner no.1.

Notice of motion for 30.03.2020.

Meanwhile, the petitioners shall join the investigation and would come present as and when called for and in the event of arrest, they shall be admitted to interim bail on their furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Investigating Officer. They shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Tarsem Singh, states that the petitioners have joined the investigation, they are no longer required for custodial interrogation and there is no other criminal case pending against them.

In view of the said facts, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 30.01.2020 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
