Case taken up through video conferencing.

The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.22 dated 19.01.2021, under Sections 147, 149, 323, 325, 452 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Kanina, District Mahendergarh.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that it is a case of version and cross-version. He also contends that petitioner No.1 had suffered a fracture on his leg while petitioner No. 2 had suffered four injuries in the occurrence. The mother of the petitioners was also injured and admitted in PGI, Rohtak. Their wives were also injured in the occurrence. The injuries which are attributed to the petitioners and other accused are simple in nature except fractures on the hand and elbow of the complainant and the injured.

Learned counsel for the complainant, however, contends that in view of the serious allegations against the petitioners, they are not entitled to the concession of anticipatory bail.

This Court, by order dated 18.08.2021 had directed the petitioners to appear before the Investigating Officer and join investigation and in the event of their arrest, they were ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from Head Constable Rakesh, states that the petitioners have joined investigation.

In view of the above and the petitioners having joined investigation, the Covid-19 Pandemic, the order dated 18.08.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.

Pending application, if any, shall also stand disposed of.
