ANIL KSHETARPAL, J.

By this order, three transfer petitions i.e TA-143-2021, TA-

144-2021 and TA-145-2021 shall stand disposed of.

The couple is residing in Australia. They are alleged to have been granted decree of divorce by the Court at Australia on 18.07.2018. The respondent-husband through attorney has filed three petitions. The first petition is for custody of the minor child, the second is suit for permanent injunction restraining the petitioner-wife from taking the minor child to Australia and the third for recovery of certain amount. The petitioner-wife prays for transfer of all the three cases to the court of competent jurisdiction at Tarn Taran.

Once both the parties are residing in Australia and the present litigation is being fought through respective attorneys, therefore, no ground to transfer the cases is made out, particularly, when all the three petitions are civil proceedings and the parties are not required to appear on each and every date. Still further, liberty is granted to the petitioner to apply for appearance through video conferencing as and when she is required to appear in person.

All the petitions stand disposed of in the abovesaid terms.
