Case taken up through video conferencing.

The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 05 dated 11.01.2021, under Sections 406, 420, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Satnali, District Mohindergarh.

Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the father of the petitioners was a caretaker of the land of Mandir Thakurji Maharaj at village Nawan. It is alleged that the father of the petitioners had executed a transfer deed of the land of Mandir Thakurji Maharaj in favour of the petitioners on 23.10.2020. He, however, contends that the transfer deed was executed inadvertently in favour of the petitioners instead of Mandir Thakurji Maharaj and the father of the petitioners had sought to rectify the error and supplementary transfer deed was executed on 30.12.2020, but the father of the petitioners expired on 31.12.2020 and they could not register the same. He also contends that the transfer deed dated 23.10.2020 has now been cancelled.

This Court, by the order dated 11.02.2021, had directed the petitioners to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of their arrest, they were ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Ramesh Kumar, states that the petitioners have joined investigation.

In view of the above and the petitioners having joined investigation, the order dated 11.02.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
