In the present writ petition filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India the petitioners seek directions for holding the written examination on account of the error commit by respondent No.1 on account of last minute change in the process and on account of lack of sufficient public notice and time on account of which they could not appear in the examination for the post of Art & Craft Teachers on 31.01.2021.

It was the case of the petitioners that they could not download the admit cards as the time given was very less in as much as the notice was issued only on 21.01.2021 that the admit cards would be available on the website from 22.01.2021 to 25.01.2021.

In response, the State has pointed out that out of four petitioners, petitioners No.2 and 3 Punam and Sumitradevi had downloaded their admit cards on 30.01.2021 and 27.01.2021.

It is not disputed that in pursuance of the advertisement notice dated 28.12.2020 (Annexure P-3) **5495** candidates had appeared in the examination for the post and only because present four petitioners alleged that they were not able to download the admit cards would not give them reason for seeking directions for holding the examination afresh, the result of which was declared on 23.02.2021.

Resultantly, this Court is of the opinion that no such case is made out to interfere in the peculiar facts and circumstances as the interests of large number of other candidates is involved who are in race for appointment since 2006, which cannot be jeopardized on account of the petitioners not being diligent enough.

Accordingly, there is no merit in the present writ petition and the same is dismissed.
