This is a petition for anticipatory bail filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., on behalf of the petitioner, in case FIR No.45, dated 16.05.2019, under Sections 326, 323, 324 and 34 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Phul, District Bathinda.

2. The copy of the MLR of victim Ranjit Singh has since been received. It goes to show that the said victim/ complainant had 'horizontal incised wound on anterior aspect of his right leg in middle with fresh bleeding' and the X-ray of the said leg subsequently described the injuries suffered by the victim as being 'grievous in nature'. The petitioner, therefore, clearly stands on a different footing from co-accused Gurpreet Singh and Angrej Singh to whom no grievous injuries are attributed in the FIR, and so he cannot claim parity with them. His prayer for extra ordinary relief of anticipatory bail in the circumstances is untenable.

3. The present petition is, therefore, ordered to be dismissed.
