Case heard *via* video conferencing.

By this petition, the petitioner seeks the concession of 'regular bail' under the provisions of Section 439 Cr.P.C., upon FIR No.193, dated 05.12.2019, having been registered at Police Station Cantonment, District Amritsar, alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under the provisions of Sections 307/120-B/148/149 of the IPC and Sections 25/27/54/59 of the Arms Act, 1959.

The role attributed to the petitioner is stated to be beating up the complainant's son, with a fire arm discharge also attributed to the petitioner, but with that not having hit the complainants' son, the shots which hit the complainants' son having been allegedly fired by one Subham Bhandari.

The petitioner is stated to have been in custody for about 1 year and 10 months now, with not even the charge framed so far in the trial, seemingly because of the ongoing pandemic.

That being so, simply looking at the period of his custody and the role attributed to the petitioner, without making any comment whatsoever on the actual merits of the case, the petition is allowed with the petitioner ordered to be admitted to bail, upon him furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial court/CJM/Duty Magistrate concerned.
