The Court has been convened through video conferencing due to Covid-19 pandemic.

Instant petition has been filed under Section 438 of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.0003 dated 13.01.2021 (Annexure P-1), registered under Sections 406, 498-A and 354 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 at Police Station Women, Amritsar.

On 22.02.2021, this Court passed the following orders:-

“The matter has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing due to outbreak of COVID-19.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he has instructions to state that the petitioner is ready to settle the dispute with the complainant for a total consideration of Rs.9,50,000/- including the value of the car.

Notice of motion.

At this stage, Mr. Avtar Singh Sandhu, Addl. AG, Punjab, has put in appearance and accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State.

Mr. Lovish Rattan, Advocate, has put in appearance and accepts notice on behalf of the complainant. The aforesaid offer is acceptable to the learned counsel for the complainant.

It being the conceded position of the learned counsel for the parties that they are ready to settle the dispute for an amount of Rs.9,50,000/- including the value of the car, the matter is referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court, so as to work out the modalities of the terms & conditions of the settlement.

The petitioner and respondent No.2 are directed to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court on 10.03.2021.

For awaiting report, list on 23.04.2021.

Till next date of hearing, arrest of the petitioner shall remain stayed.”

Report of the Mediator has been received.

Perusal of the proceedings before the Mediator shows that the petitioner has not appear before the Mediation & Conciliation Centre of this Court.

In the face of this situation, counsel for the petitioner prays for withdrawal of the instant petition.

Permitted to do so.

Dismissed as withdrawn.
