The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.216 dated 04.09.2020 under Sections 148, 149, 341, 323, 325, 307, 365, 506, 120-B IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act, registered at Police Station Sadar Ratia, District Fatehabad.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is not named in the FIR wherein it is stated that co-accused, namely, Vikram along with others had assaulted the complainant and the injured. No specific injury has been attributed to the petitioner and the injury for which offence under Section 307 IPC has been invoked is attributed to co-accused Vikram. It is alleged that the accused had tried to abduct the complainant but they fled when they saw another vehicle approaching. He also contends that the petitioner is in custody for over five months since his arrest on 29.09.2020. Co-accused, namely, Jiwan Singh, Sandeep @ Sunny and Husanpreet Singh @ Hushi have been granted regular bail by this Court in CRM-M-986-2021, CRM-M-2224-2021 and CRM-M-4271-2021 on 14.01.2021, 22.01.2021 and

12.02.2021 respectively.

Learned State counsel upon instructions contends that although challan has been filed but charges are yet to be framed. He also contends that the petitioner is involved in several other cases.

Heard through video conferencing.

In view of the above especially when the petitioner is in custody for over five months, no specific injury has been attributed to him, co-accused have been granted bail, the COVID-19 pandemic and the conclusion of the trial is likely to take some time, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the instant petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
