The instant petition has been filed under Section 439 Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.87, dated 30.04.2019, registered under Sections 304(B), 34 IPC at Police Station Uchana, District Jind.

Counsel for the petitioner would contend that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the said matter and is in custody for more than 2 years. It is argued that material prosecution witnesses have already been examined and there is no chance of the petitioner influencing them.

On the other hand, learned State counsel would submit that FSL report is available which would reveal that aluminium phosphide was detected in exhibits-1a, 1b and 1c which are from parts of stomach, small and large intestines, lungs, liver, spleen and kidney besides the blood of the

deceased. It is argued that out of total 23 witnesses, 13 have already been examined and the next date of hearing is 13.12.2021 and the trial is likely to be concluded expeditiously.

In view of the submissions made and the stage of the trial, I find no ground for grant of regular bail to the petitioner considering the fact that FSL report reveals the presence of aluminium phosphide.

Accordingly, the present petition stands dismissed.

At this stage, counsel for the petitioner requests that trial Court be directed to conclude the trial expeditiously and preferably within a period of five months.

Ordered accordingly.
