1. Case is being taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing due to Covid-19 pandemic.

2. Allowed as prayed for.

3. Application is for impleading the complainant as respondent No.2. Learned counsel for the non-applicant/petitioner states that he has no objection if the complainant is impleaded as respondent No.2 in the instant petition.

4. In view of the statement of learned counsel for the petitioner, the application is allowed and complainant is impleaded as respondent No.2.

5. Prayer in the second petition (the first petition having been dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to file fresh petition with better particulars) under Section 438 Cr.P.C. is for grant of anticipatory bail in case

323, 506, 148, 149 IPC and Sections 25, 27, 54, 59 of Arms Act (Sections 325, 429 IPC and Section 11 Animals Cruelty Act, 1960 added later on and Sections 307, 379-B IPC and 25 Arms Act, 1959 deleted) at Police Station Rangar Nangal, District Batala, Punjab.

6. Learned counsel for the petitioner has placed on record affidavits executed by the complainant and her mother and sister pursuant to compromise and amicable settlement of the dispute between the parties and contends that the petitioner and complainant-respondent No. 2 would also be filing petition for quashing of the FIR in question along with all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom on the basis of affidavits dated 15.03.2021 & 20.03.2021 respectively furnished by the complainant-Kulwinder Kaur, her mother and her sister to the effect that they had entered into a compromise with the petitioner and had no objection if the prayer of the petitioner for grant of pre arrest bail was accepted and also that they did not wish to proceed further in the matter.

7. Learned Asst. AG, Punjab, on instructions from ASI Nishant Singh, confirms the amicable settlement of the dispute between the parties by way of compromise as also of the complainant, her mother and sister having given the above mentioned affidavits.

8. Accordingly, in the light of the position noted above, prayer of the petitioner is accepted and the petitioner is directed to join investigation and fully cooperate with the police. However, in the event of arrest of the petitioner, the petitioner is ordered to be released on pre-arrest bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of the

Arresting / Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

9. Petition stands disposed of in aforementioned terms.
