Case has been taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing.

This is a petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of appropriate direction to respondents No.2 and 3 (Superintendent of Police, Palwal and S.H.O. Police Station Camp, District Palwal) to protect life and liberty of petitioners at the hands of private respondents.

The facts in brief, leading to the writ petition are that Anjali (petitioner No.1) got married with respondent-Kuldeep, who is drug addict. Though petitioner No.1-Anjali had conveyed her disliking of respondent-Kuldeep to her in-laws as well as her parents but on their insistence, she was asked to abide by her matrimonial obligations. Thereafter, petitioner No.1-Anjali came in contact of petitioner No.2-Lokesh, who is living near to the

locality of her in-laws. Petitioners fell in love and started living together. When the relationship of the petitioners came to the knowledge of private respondents, they turned against their alliance. Petitioners apprehend that the private respondents would cause harm to them, therefore, they submitted a representation dated 24.02.2021 (Annexure P-3) to respondent No.2-Superintendent of Police, District Palwal, whereupon no action has been taken.

Learned counsel for the petitioners *inter alia* contends that petitioners being in love are living together, but they are facing threats at the hands of private respondents, therefore, they deserve protection. She further submits that though representation (Annexure P/3) has already been given to respondent No.2-Superintendent of Police, Palwal, however, nothing fruitful has been done so far, therefore, petitioners have approached this Court to seek protection to their life and liberty. She further urges that appropriate directions may be issued in that regard.

Notice of motion to respondents No.1 to 3 only.

At the asking of Court, Mr. Vikrant Pamboo, Deputy Advocate General, Haryana, accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3. Complete copy of paper book has been supplied to him.

Learned State counsel submits that petitioners have entered into unholy alliance as petitioner No.1-Anjali is still married to respondent-Kuldeep and their marriage has not been dissolved so far in accordance with law.

Having heard learned counsel for the parties and perusal of record, this Court is of the considered opinion that petitioner No.1-Anjali, who is already married with respondent-Kuldeep, now she has entered into relations with petitioner No.2-Lokesh, without getting her marriage dissolved with above said Kuldeep. Representation dated 24.02.2021 (Annexure P/3) submitted by petitioners to respondent No.2-Superintendent of Police, Palwal, is devoid of material particulars and even manner and mode of alleged threats extended to the petitioners have not been detailed therein. Petitioner No.1-Anjali has entered into unholy alliance with petitioner No.2-Lokesh and the petition is based on bald averments without any supportive material. Since the petitioners have filed this petition without a valid and convincing cause of action, therefore, instant petition being devoid of merits, is dismissed.
