The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.66 dated 10.12.2020, under Sections 342, 379, 323, 506, 148, 149 IPC (Sections 325, 365, 379-B IPC added later on and Section 379 IPC was deleted), registered at Police Station Arif Ke, district Ferozepur.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that there was a dispute with regard to the payment of wages to an employee of the complainant and the petitioner was allegedly helping the employee being his brother.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Angrej Singh, states that the petitioner along with other accused had hit the complainant repeatedly with *dandas* and dragged him to his house where he was again beaten up. He fractured his left wrist. He also contends that the part of the incident especially the place from where the complainant was being dragged to the house of the petitioner has been captured in a video and a sum of ₹30,000/- was also snatched.

Heard.

The petitioner is stated to have dragged the complainant to his home and had given several blows with *danda* which had resulted in a fracture on his hand. The petitioner is also alleged to have taken away ₹30,000/- from the complainant. In view of the serious allegations, the petitioner is not entitled to the concession of the anticipatory bail.

Consequently, the petition stands dismissed.
