MANOJ BAJAJ, J.

Petitioner has filed this petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of directions to official respondent Nos.1 to 3 to protect her life and liberty from the hands of respondent Nos.4 and 5 and also to not to interfere in her peaceful life.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has argued that respondent N.4, who is husband of the petitioner, maltreated her and threw her out of the matrimonial house. According to the learned counsel, respondent No.4 used to give bearings to his wife and the parents of the petitioner are also not supporting her. He submits that she has apprehension of threat to her life and in this regard, a representation was given to respondent Nos.2 and 3 and since the grievance of the petitioner has not been redressed by the official respondents, therefore, necessary directions be issued for providing protection to the petitioner.

After hearing the learned counsel for the petitioner and perusing the paper book, this court finds that the averments in the writ petition, as well as the contents of representation do not contain the material facts, like date of marriage and her separation, much less the manner and mode of alleged threat. Even otherwise, the alternative remedy in law is available to the petitioner, therefore, this court does not find it to be a fit case for exercising extraordinary writ jurisdiction.

The petition is dismissed.
