The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No. 90 dated 06.07.2020, under Sections 302, 120-B, 148 and 149 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860, besides Sections 25/27/54/59 of the Arms Act, 1959, registered at Police Station Gharinda, District Amritsar (Rural).

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that although the petitioner is named in the FIR, but she was unarmed and no injury is attributed to her. She is the wife of co-accused, namely, Major Singh and has been falsely implicated. Co-accused Major Singh is in custody. The son of the complainant had died due to solitary gunshot injury, which is attributed to co-accused, namely, Gurpreet Singh. He further contends that co-accused, namely, Sukhjot Kaur @ Sokhi has been granted anticipatory bail by this Court in CRM-M-10709 of 2021.

Learned counsel for the complainant, however, contends that in view of the serious allegations against the petitioner, she is not entitled to the concession of anticipatory bail.

This Court, by order dated 09.03.2021 had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of her arrest, she was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Angrej Singh, states that although the petitioner has joined investigation but the allegations against her are serious.

In view of the above and the petitioner having joined investigation, the Covid-19 Pandemic, the order dated 09.03.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. She shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
