The petitioner prays for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.153 dated 16.11.2019, registered under Sections 323, 324, 326, 341, 148, 149 IPC at Police Station Rajasansi, Amritsar (Rural), District Amritsar.

The operative part of the order dated 02.03.2020, vide which interim anticipatory bail has been granted to the petitioner, is reproduced as under:-

“...Counsel for the petitioner submits that 05 of the coaccused have already been granted the concession of anticipatory bail and the injury attributed to the petitioner is on the elbow of the left arm of the complainant. It is further submitted that there is a delay of 04 days in registration of the FIR.

Counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Pargat Singh, has not disputed the factual position but opposed the prayer for bail.

Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that, in pursuance to the order dated 02.03.2020, the petitioner has appeared before the Investigating Officer and has joined the investigation.

Counsel for the State, on instructions from SI Vikramjeet Singh, has not disputed the aforesaid fact and submits that the petitioner is no more required for further investigation.

In view of the above, this petition is allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated 02.03.2020 is made absolute subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
