Petitioners have filed this petition under Article 226 Constitution of India for issuance of directions to respondent Nos.2 and 3 to protect their life and liberty from the hands of private respondent Nos.4 and 5 and further not to allow them to interfere in their peaceful life.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has argued that the parties have entered into a marriage on 11.03.2021 against the wishes of the private respondent Nos.4 and 5. He submits that since the private respondents were against their alliance, therefore, they are extending threats to them and a representation (Annexure P-4) in this regard was given to the Commissioner of Police, Jalandhar on 11.03.2021 itself. However, till date no action has been taken thereon, therefore, he prays for issuance of necessary directions.

The above averments clearly indicate that the representation sent by the petitioners by post to respondent No.2 had not reached when the petition was drafted or filed on 12.03.2021. The petitioners have expressed

apprehension of their implication in a criminal case at the instance of the private respondents, and this in the opinion of the court cannot be considered as a threat as the private respondents, who are parents of the girl, have a right to adopt a remedy in law.

Resultantly, the petition fails and is dismissed.
