The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C in case bearing FIR No.92 dated 30.08.2019 registered under Sections 341, 323, 325, 379, 427, 506, 148, 149 and 120-B IPC at Police Station Banur, District Patiala.

On 19.03.2020 following order was passed:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner relies upon pendency of CRM-M No.2308 of 2020 and contends that the petitioner is an author of simple injury on the right hip of the complainant. The occurrence took place on 31.3.2019 and the FIR came to be registered on 30.8.2019 i.e. after a period of five months. Co-accused, namely, Labh Singh and Paramveer Singh @ Sony have already been granted interim bail by this Court.

Notice of motion for 23.3.2020.

In the meanwhile, petitioner is directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer to join investigation on 20.3.2020 at 11.00 a.m. and in the event of his arrest, he shall be enlarged on ad interim bail, subject to his furnishing requisite bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

To be heard along with CRM-M No.2308 of 2020”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that in compliance of the order dated 19.03.2020, the petitioner has joined the investigation to the entire satisfaction of the Investigating Officer.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Gurjit Singh admits the aforesaid fact and submits that the petitioner is no more required for further investigation of the case.

Keeping in view the inter se relationship between the accused and the complainant side and without meaning anything on the merits of the case, I deem it appropriate to confirm the order dated 19.03.2020.

Accordingly, the interim order dated 19.03.2020 is made absolute. Petitioner shall keep on joining the investigation as and when required to do so and he shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Petition stands disposed of.
