Case has been taken up for hearing through Video Conferencing.

This petition under Sections 482/483 Cr.P.C. has been moved by petitioner for quashing of order dated 02.03.2021 (Annexure P/1) passed by respondent No.1-State Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission, Punjab, Chandigarh, in Execution Application No.37 of 2021 in Consumer Complaint No.109 of 2020, in terms of which, non-bailable warrant was issued against the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner *inter alia* contends that though petitioner used to appear before State Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission, Punjab, Chandigarh, on each and every date of hearing but on account of single default made at her instance on 02.03.2021 and that too

arrest returnable for 15.03.2021 and now the case is fixed for 06.04.2021. He further submits that petitioner is ready to appear before State Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission, Punjab, Chandigarh.

Since impugned order dated 02.03.2021 passed by State Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission, Punjab, Chandigarh, has arisen out of Execution Application No.37 of 2021 in Consumer Complaint No.109 of 2020, I do not consider it appropriate to interfere in this petition in exercise of inherent powers as envisaged under Section 482 Cr.P.C. and hence, instant petition is dismissed.

However, petitioner, if so advised, may appear before the Executing Authority i.e. State Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission, Punjab, Chandigarh, to avail appropriate remedy, in accordance with law.
