Case taken up through video conferencing.

The petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.28 dated 09.03.2021, under Sections 332, 353, 186, 427, 148, 506 IPC, registered at Police Station City Balachaur, District Shaheed Bhagat Singh.

On 06.04.2021, a Coordinate Bench of this Court had passed the following order:-

Heard.

The application is allowed and the documents filed as Annexure P/3 are taken on record.

The application stands disposed of.

Main case

Learned counsel for the petitioners, *inter-alia*, submits
that the petitioners herein have been falsely implicated in the

instant FIR. In support of his contention, he relies on the affidavits of the Municipal Councillors, Balachaur. It is submitted that the affidavits of the Municipal Councillors themselves would reflect that no such incident had taken place as alleged in the FIR. It is also argued that as on date there is no MLR available to substantiate that any injury was inflicted upon the officials of the Punjab State Power Corporation Limited. On the contrary, petitioner No.2 himself has suffered injuries at the hands of the Corporation officials.

Notice of motion.

Ms. Rashmi Attri, AAG, Punjab, who is present through the medium of video conferencing, accepts notice on behalf of the respondent- State and seeks time to file reply.

Adjourned to 1.10.2021.

Meanwhile, the petitioners are directed to join the investigation within a period of one week and on their doing so, in the event of arrest the petitioners be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioners shall continue to join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Sikander Pal,

states that the petitioners have joined investigation. He, however, contends that

the petitioners have obstructed the officials of the Punjab State Power Corporation Limited for discharging their official duty and, therefore, they are not entitled to the concession of anticipatory bail.

In view of the above and the petitioners having joined investigation, the order dated 06.04.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
