The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.26 dated 16.02.2021, under Sections 323, 324, 34 IPC and Section 326 IPC added later on, registered at Police Station Shahkot, District Jalandhar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the FIR is the outcome of a sudden quarrel and the petitioner is willing to settle the matter with the complainant. They are residents of the same village owning adjoining land. He also contends that the petitioner is attributed solitary stick blow on the head which was found to be simple in nature. He further contends that the injury for which offence punishable under Section 326 IPC has been invoked is attributed to co-accused, namely, Harpreet Singh. He also contends that co-accused Gurjinder Singh @ Gora has been granted anticipatory bail by this Court in CRM-M-13820-2021.

Without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case and in view of the submissions of learned counsel for the petitioner especially when

the petitioner is stated to have given a simple injury, co-accused has already been granted anticipatory bail, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, the petitioner is directed to appear before the Investigating Officer within a period of 15 days from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order and on his doing so, he shall be released on bail to the satisfaction of the arresting/investigating officer till submission of report under Section 173 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 ('Cr.P.C.' - for short). The petitioner shall continue to join investigation and shall furnish an undertaking that he shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C. Thereafter, he will be permitted to furnish regular bail bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.

The petition stands disposed of in the aforementioned terms.
