The petitioner seeks benefits of pay-scale of the post of Signaller from the year 2012-13 while he was working as Telephone Attendant.

It is not disputed that the petitioner retired on 30.09.2016 and thus, is staking his claim for benefits which had accrued to him for 2012-13. In such circumstances, this Court is of the opinion that extraordinary writ jurisdiction at the belated stage is not liable to be exercised. Merely by serving the legal notice as such would not give cause of action for the benefits of invoking the extraordinary writ jurisdiction.

Faced with the situation, learned counsel for the petitioner does not wish to press the present writ petition and prays for liberty to approach the Civil Court for necessary relief.

Ordered accordingly.
