The Superintendent of Police, Panipat, having been directed to file his own reply to the petition, that having been filed, learned counsel for the petitioners point to paragraph 3 of the reply on merits, which reads as follows:-

“That in reply to the contents of para no.3 of the petition it is submitted that the provisions of Section 42 of the NDPS Act have not been found to be complied by SI Dalbir Singh. The ownership record

of the petitioner pertaining to the place of recovered contraband has also not been collected by SI Dalbir Singh and the rough site-map of the spot was prepared. It would be pertinent to mention here that SI Dalbir Singh has been retired from the department on 31/03/2019 and the distance between the house of the petitioner where the petitioner is residing and the place from where contraband has been recovered is approx. 3KM.”

That being so, without making any further comment on the actual merits of the case, both the petitions are allowed and the petitioners are ordered to be released on bail, subject to their furnishing adequate bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial court.

A copy of this order be also placed on the file of the other connected matter too.
