Case taken up through video conferencing.

On 07.04.2021, a Coordinate Bench of this Court had passed the following order:-

“Learned Senior counsel for the petitioners contends that in the FIR five accused have been nominated including father of the petitioners as co-accused. Petitioner No.1 is a student of MBA (4th Semester) and is giving examination. Petitioner No.2 is practicing as Chartered Accountant under the name and style of 'SM Arora & Associates'. Father of the petitioners was arrested and the petitioners have been nominated in the disclosure statement of their father wherein he has disclosed that his sons used to help him in the business of using old stamp papers for personal benefits by selling the same to different customers.

Notice of motion.

In the meanwhile, the petitioners are directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer to join investigation on 13.04.2021 at 11.00 a.m. and in the event of their arrest, they shall be enlarged on *ad interim* bail, on their furnishing requisite bail bonds/surety bonds subject to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, the petitioners shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.

Adjourned to 07.07.2021.

It is made clear that grant of interim order shall not be taken to be an expression on merits of the case in any manner. The case shall be considered on merits on the adjourned date.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Arshdeep Sharma, states that the petitioners have joined investigation.

In view of the above and the petitioners having joined investigation, the order dated 07.04.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioners is made absolute.

However, the petitioners shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
