Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.28 dated 13.02.2021 registered under Sections 323/328/34 IPC at P.S. Civil Lines, District Batala.

On 22.04.2021, following order was passed by this Court:-

"The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

In compliance of order dated 09.04.2021, learned counsel for the petitioner has sent the report issued by Guru Ram Das Charitable Hospital, Sri Amritsar, showing that the complainant was admitted with the history of alleged intake of All Out Mosquito repellent. He was vomiting and there was loss of consciousness. The vomit

was never tested by way of chemical analysis. The very allegation of serving poisonous tea to the complainant is not prima-facie established as the intake of tea would have resulted in burning of mouth and tongue. It is not the case of the complainant that cold tea was forcibly poured in his mouth.

Notice of motion for 20.07.2021.

*In the meanwhile, petitioner is directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer to join investigation on **28.04.2021** at 11.00 a.m. and in the event of his arrest, she shall be enlarged on interim bail, subject to her furnishing requisite bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.*

Nothing expressed hereinabove shall be construed to be an opinion on the merits of the case. The case shall be decided on merits on the adjourned date.”

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that in compliance of the aforesaid order, the petitioner has joined the investigation on 28.04.2021 to the entire satisfaction of the Investigating Officer.

Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Jasbir Singh admitted the aforesaid fact and submitted that the petitioner is no more required for further investigation of the case.

In view of aforesaid factual position, the interim order dated 22.04.2021 is made absolute. Petitioner shall keep on joining the investigation as and when required to do so and she

shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2)
Cr.P.C.

Petition stands disposed of.
