1. This petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus for directing the respondents No. 1 to 4 to get the roads inside Sector 16, Faridabad where the respondent No.5 has installed four gates without any authority and thus obstructed easy access to the residents of Sector to go and come from their houses.

2. By this petition the petitioner has stated that he is a resident of H.No. 1334, Greek Park Residents Welfare Society (Regd.), Sector-16, Faridabad and he is aggrieved with the action of the respondent No.5 in installing four gates on the four roads which lead to the Green Park Residents Welfare Society and out of which as per him three are permanently closed. His contention is that three gates cannot be kept

permanently locked and even if they have to be locked there should be a guard available who would be responsible to open the gate for any person who wants to enter or exit the society for any reason. He further states that as a matter of fact by Annexure P-7 this was the solution which was suggested by the respondent No.3. We find some merit in this suggestion. However, we do not deem it appropriate to exercise our extraordinary jurisdiction at this stage, but direct the petitioner to send a copy of this petition along with all Annexures (copy of this order also) to respondent No.5. The respondent No.5 is directed to meet with the petitioner so that this issue can be sorted out in a non-adversial manner and a right balance is struck between the right of ingress and egress and the security aspects.

3. Petition stands disposed of with above-terms.

4. Since the main case has been decided, the pending application, if any, stands disposed of.
