Case heard via video conferencing.

By this petition, the petitioner seeks the concession of 'regular bail' under the provisions of Section 439 of the Cr.P.C., upon FIR no.0185, dated 10.02.2020, having been registered at Police Station Old Industrial Panipat, alleging therein the commission of offences punishable under Sections 406 and 506 of the IPC, with Sections 120-B, 195, 203, 211, 420, 467, 468 and 471 of the IPC added later (and Sections 406 and 506 of the IPC deleted later).

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner was in fact the complainant in the FIR but subsequently he has been falsely implicated on collusion by the investigating officer with another co-accused and consequently he may be admitted to bail, he also having been in custody since 15.01.2021 and with a co-accused of his having been admitted to bail by this court on 19.03.2021 (co-ordinate Bench).

Upon query to learned State counsel, he submits that the JCB machine as is alleged to have been fraudulently sold, has been recovered and in fact the money that was transferred by the actual purchaser (Sabir), was to the account of the co-accused who has been admitted to bail.

That being so, without making any comment on the actual merits of the case and in view the fact that the trial is not likely to be concluded in the near future in this pandemic, the petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be admitted to bail to the satisfaction of the trial court.
