This petition has been filed by the petitioners under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.62 dated 03.04.2021, under Sections 420 and 120-B IPC 1860, registered at Police Station, Sadar Ludhiana, District Police Commissionerate, Ludhiana. The petitioners apprehend their arrest at the hands of police.

Learned counsel for the petitioners has argued that the allegations contained in the FIR relate to the agreement to sell allegedly executed in the year 2013 and during the pendency of this petition, the parties have entered into an amicable settlement by way of a compromise. Copy of the compromise was produced before this court on 23.06.2021 and at that stage, learned State counsel had sought time to verify the

compromise.

Today, Mr.Ramandeep Sandhu, assisted by ASI Pritpal Singh, has filed affidavit of Jashandeep Singh Gill, PPS, Assistant Commissioner of Police (South), Ludhiana along with statement of complainant Annexure R-1/T and stated that indeed the parties have entered into an amicable settlement.

Considering the above, the petition is allowed and it is ordered that in the event of arrest, the petitioners shall be admitted to bail on their furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioners shall abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. They shall also join the investigation as and when called by the police.
