Case taken up through video conferencing.

The petitioner is seeking regular bail in FIR No.12 dated 17.01.2021, under Sections 307, 458, 324, 323, 506, 148, 149 IPC and later on 307 IPC was deleted by the police, registered at Police Station Tripri, District Patiala.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that it is alleged in the FIR that the petitioner had given a knife blow on the cheek of the son of the complainant for which offence under Section 324 IPC was invoked. The son of the complainant has fully recovered from the injury. The petitioner is in custody for almost 04 months since his arrest on 22.01.2021 and is not involved in any other case.

Learned State counsel upon instructions from SI Jagga Singh states that the challan has been filed but charges are yet to be framed. He also contends that the complainant in her supplementary statement had stated that the petitioner had given a blow with an iron rod on the shoulder of the injured Sumit and had also given a fist blow on the face of another injured.

Heard through video conferencing.

In view of the above, especially when the petitioner is in custody for almost 04 months, injuries attributed to the petitioner are simple in nature, Covid 19 pandemic and the conclusion of the trial is likely to take some time, I deem it a fit case to grant the concession of regular bail to the petitioner.

Therefore, without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, the petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on regular bail on his furnishing requisite bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned.
