A Coordinate Bench of this Court on 30.04.2021 had passed the following order:-

“Instant petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr. PC for grant of anticipatory Bail to the petitioner in FIR No.24 dated 06.04.2021 for the offences under Section 306 IPC registered at Police Station Hathur, District Ludhiana Rural.

Learned counsel for the petitioner inter alia contends that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the case in hand just because she happens to be the sister-in-law of the deceased (wife's sister). Learned counsel submits that the deceased and his wife had strained relations and wife left her matrimonial home along with her children three months prior to the occurrence in question. He further contends that the only role attributed to the petitioner in the FIR in question is that as and when the deceased would object to the illicit relations of his wife, the petitioner and other relatives would threaten him which led him to end his life. He further submits that it is thus, evident that the ingredients of abatement under Section 107 IPC are clearly not made out and hence even the

mischief of Section 306 IPC is amiss in the case in hand.

Meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation and appear before the investigating agency as and when called upon to do so. In the event of her arrest, she shall be admitted to interim bail on her furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall abide by the terms and conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel, upon instructions from ASI Jagjit Singh, states that the petitioner has joined investigation.

In view of the above and the petitioner having joined investigation, the Covid-19 Pandemic, the order dated 30.04.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. She shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
