This petition has been filed under the provisions of Section 439 of the Cr.P.C., for grant of 'regular bail' to the petitioner in case FIR No. 27, dated 22.02.2018, registered at Police Station Loharu, District Bhiwani, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under the provisions of Sections 346/302/201/34/109 of the IPC and Section 3 (2) (v) of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities), Act, 1989.

Pursuant to the order dated 21.05.2021, a reply to the petition by way of an affidavit of the Deputy Superintendent of Police, Loharu, has been filed, stating therein, amongst other things, that out of 29 prosecution witnesses 14 had been examined with 08 given up and with therefore only 07 remaining to be examined.

It has also been stated that four "private witnesses" and all other witnesses as had been examined, had supported the case of the prosecution with none declared to be hostile.

In view of the above, I see no ground to entertain this petition, which is consequently dismissed.

Naturally, once normal hearing resumes before the trial court in the face of the ongoing pandemic, that court would endeavor to conclude the trial at the very earliest, considering the fact that the petitioner has been in custody now for more than 3½ years.
