The case has been taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.119 dated 18.07.2020 registered under Sections 186, 225, 120-B IPC and Sections 29, 61, 85 of the NDPS Act at Police Station Cantonment, District Police Commissionerate Amritsar.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the FIR was registered on the basis of secret information to the effect that the petitioner is indulging in selling of contraband. A search was conducted. Petitioner was not found present at his house, but his family members tried to obstruct the police from

searching the house. However, later on, they agreed to allow the police party to search the house. On search of the house, nothing incriminating could be recovered. FIR has been registered for the offences under Sections 186, 225, 120-B IPC and Sections 29, 61, 85 of the NDPS Act.

On 17.05.2021, following order was passed by this Court:-

“Notice of motion.

Learned State counsel, on advance service, joins proceedings and accepts notice on behalf of the respondent-State of Punjab and seeks time to get instructions.

Adjourned to 14.07.2021.

In the meanwhile, petitioner shall join the investigation within a period of 15 days and subject thereto, no coercive steps qua arrest of the petitioner shall be taken till the next date of hearing.

Learned State counsel to file a report on or before the next date of hearing.”
