The Court has been convened through video conferencing due to
Covid-19 pandemic.

On 10.04.2019, the following orders were passed:-

“Prayer in this petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. has been made for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner, in case, FIR No.268 dated 10.10.2018, registered under Section 380 IPC at Police Station Kharar City, Kharar, Punjab.

According to the prosecution, on 13.08.2018, the petitioner, being son of landlord, along with co-accused Jaspreet Singh and others tried to vacate the premises owned by Manjit Singh, father of the petitioner and took away articles by breaking open the lock.

Learned counsel contends that petitioner has falsely been implicated in the instant case. No recovery is to be effected from him. Co-accused of the petitioner namely, Manjit Singh has already been granted the concession of anticipatory bail by this Court vide order dated 01.04.2019 passed in CRM-M-14660-2019. Treating the case of the petitioner on same parity, he may also be granted the concession of anticipatory bail.

Notice of motion.

At the asking of the Court, Ms. Sudeepti Sharma, Addl.A.G., Punjab has accepted notice on behalf of the respondent-State. Requisite number of copies of the paper book be supplied to learned State counsel, during the course of the day.

List on 23.07.2019.

In the meantime, the petitioner shall join the investigation and would come present as and when called for and in the event of arrest, he shall be admitted to interim bail on his furnishing personal and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall also abide by the conditions as specified under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Interim protection granted to co-accused in CRM-M-14660-2019 has been made absolute by this Court vide order dated 20.05.2019.

Learned State counsel, upon instructions, from ASI Lakhwinder Singh submits that petitioner has joined the investigation and he is no longer required.

In view of the above fact, but without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed. Order dated 10.04.2019 is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 (2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
