Case is taken up for hearing through video conferencing.

The petitioner has filed this second petition under Section 439 of Cr.P.C. for grant of regular bail in case bearing FIR No. 160 dated 08.05.2020, registered under Sections 304-B, at Police Station Sadar, Narnaul, District Mahendergarh.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in the present case. There is no specific allegation against the petitioner. The marriage of the petitioner and the daughter of complainant, namely, Reena was solemnised on 28.02.2017. As per the allegations, the daughter of the complainant was being tortured by the petitioner for dowry. Moreover, the Swift car, which is alleged to have been

given at the time of marriage, was on loan and the installments is being paid by the petitioner to the Bank. The daughter of the complainant has committed suicide, as she had an impression that the petitioner is in relation with some other lady.

Learned State counsel, while vehemently opposing the prayer for bail, submits that there are specific and serious allegations against the petitioner, who was the husband of the daughter of the complainant. The deceased had committed suicide at her matrimonial home within a period of three years of her marriage.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties.

Since the deceased had committed suicide at her matrimonial home within a period of three years of her marriage, the prayer of the petitioner for grant of concession of regular bail does not have any merit.

Dismissed.
