to the Gram Panchayat, Bharaj through respondent No. 3, i.e. Sarpanch, Gram Panchayat, Bharaj in terms of order dated 06.03.2020, in CWP-23867-2016, as per affidavit of respondent No.3-Harpal Kaur, present Sarpanch of Gram Panchayat, Bharaj, no action is called for against the respondents under the Contempt of Courts Act, 1971. Accordingly, the contempt petition is disposed of as such.
