The Court has been convened through video conferencing due to Covid-19 pandemic.

Instant petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for issuance of a direction to respondent No.2 to look into the representation dated 31.05.2021 (Annexure P-4) submitted by the petitioner.

Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that son of the petitioner, Shamsher Singh died an unnatural death and DDR No.14 dated 27.10.2020 (Annexure P-1) was recorded, postmortem was conducted on 27.10.2020 (Annexure P-2) and viscera, which was sent for Chemical Examination, has not been collected, despite a lapse of more than nine months.

State has filed status report by way of affidavit of Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sub-Division City Pathankot, District Pathankot, wherein, it has been submitted that two officials were found to be responsible for the delay, against whom departmental proceedings have been initiated.

During the course of hearing today, State counsel has sent report bearing Despatch No.3301 dated 13.08.2021 of the Chemical Examiner through e-mail, wherein the following observation has been made by the Analyst:

“No poison detected in the contents of exhibits I, II, III, IV & V.”

The report is taken on record.

In view of the above development, no order is called for.

Petition is dismissed.
