Case taken up through video conferencing.

The petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.113 dated 26.03.2021, under Sections 406, 420 & 120 IPC, registered at Police Station Old Faridabad, District Faridabad.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that there is a delay of about 2 years in registering the FIR. The allegations are civil in nature. It is alleged that the original owner Nathu had executed lease deed in favour of Ram Lal and Sushma Sehgal on 19.04.1982 for a period of 99 years. Sushma Sehgal had executed general power of attorney in favour of Waseem Beg on 20.12.2018 qua her share which was one half of the aforementioned land. Waseem Beg had entered into an agreement to sell on 19.03.2019 with Brahm Prakash, Ram Kumar and Munim Singh. The petitioner was not satisfied with the deal

and instead Waseem Beg had executed GPA in favour of one Kailash, Brahm

Parkash and Ram Kumar. The petitioner is only an attesting witness to the GPA and, therefore, he would be entitled to the concession of anticipatory bail.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the matter has been compromised.

This Court, by the order dated 03.08.2021, had directed the petitioner to appear before the Investigating Officer and join the investigation and in the event of his arrest, he was ordered to be released on ad-interim bail to the satisfaction of the Investigating/Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Rampal, states that the petitioner has joined investigation.

In view of the above and the petitioner having joined investigation, the order dated 03.08.2021 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute.

However, the petitioner shall abide by the conditions stipulated under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. He shall also join investigation as and when called upon to do so.

The petition stands disposed of.
