The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C., for issuance of appropriate directions to respondent No.2 to 5 for taking action in pursuance to the complaint dated 28.09.2020 (Annexure P-4) filed by the petitioner to the official respondents.

Learned counsel submits that despite representation (Annexure P-4) having been made to Senior Superintendent of Police, SAS Nagar Mohali, which was followed by repeated reminders (Annexure P-6 to P-9) for manhandling the petitioner after entering into the house, no action has been taken by the police authorities. It has been contended that the official respondents have been sitting over the matter and despite cognizable offences having been committed by the private respondents, the official respondents have failed to proceed against them under the provisions of law.

Learned counsel has further submitted that the official respondents are under legal obligation to pass an appropriate order on his representation, which clearly discloses the commission of cognizable offences.

Notice of motion.

On the asking of the Court Mr. Luvinder Sofat, AAG Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents.

In the wake of the prayer made by the petitioner, the petition is disposed off with a direction to the respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, SAS Nagar Mohali, to look into the grievance of the petitioner and take appropriate steps, if any required, under the provisions of law. However, if the respondent does not find any substance or merit in the allegations levelled by him, much less, commission of cognizable offences, then the petitioner be duly informed as per the parameters laid down by the Apex Court in **Lalita Kumari Vs. Government of Uttar Pradesh & Ors 2013(4) RCR (Criminal) 979.**
