MANOJ BAJAJ, J.

This petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C seeking issuance of directions to respondent Nos.1 to 3 for taking up the application moved by the petitioner.

Learned counsel has argued that respondent No.4 was married to petitioner's son, namely, Manik Sharma and because of the interference of her parents, the differences in the matrimonial relations of the couple erupted. She has argued that the petitioner is presently residing with his daughter at Mohali and respondent No.4 is presently occupying his house situated at Hoshiarpur. According to learned counsel, respondent Nos.4 to 6 are harassing the petitioner and have been threatening the petitioner on the ground that they would submit a complaint against him before the police. She has invited the attention of the Court to the representation dated 10.06.2021 (Annexure P-5) to

Senior Superintendent of Police, Hoshiarpur, whereupon no action has been taken so far. She prays issuance of necessary directions.

A perusal of the representation reveals that the grievance of the petitioner relates to the humiliation, mental agony and torture etc. at the hands of his daughter-in-law & her parents and the prayer in the representation is for looking into the false complaints given by respondent No.4 and for taking action against her and her parents. Since the matter is pending consideration before Senior Superintendent of Police, Hoshiarpur as the representation was given recently on 10.06.2021, therefore, this Court does not find any ground to exercise inherent powers under Section 482 Cr.P.C at this stage.

Dismissed.
