The Court has been convened through video conferencing due to Covid-19 Pandemic.

Instant petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of anticipatory bail in Complaint No. 16812/2018 dated 28.08.2018 titled as Ravinder Singh Gill Versus Sandeep Kumar, which is pending in the Court of JMIC, Chandigarh.

At the outset, counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner does not want to press the petition. However, he has instructions to state that the petitioner will surrender before the trial Court and furnish the bail bonds along with surety as directed by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Chandigarh, vide order dated 22.02.2021 (Annexure P-2) and also deposit costs of Rs.10,000/-.

Let petitioner surrender before the trial Court within a period of

three weeks from today and furnish surety as ordered by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Chandigarh, vide order (Annexure P-2). In case he does so, the trial Court shall accept the same. This will be subject to deposit of costs of Rs.10,000/- with the Poor Patient Welfare Fund PGIMER, Sector 12, Chandigarh, which shall be a pre-condition to the release of petitioner on bail.

Non-bailable warrants issued by the trial Court to secure the presence of petitioner shall be kept in abeyance for a period of three weeks from today.
