The present petitions have been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in case FIR No.0060, dated 26.05.2021, under Section 306 IPC, registered at Police Station Kheri Nodh Singh, District Fatehgarh Sahib.

Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner states that a

perusal of the FIR leaves no manner of doubt that the entire in-law's family of the complainant's deceased daughter namely Kamaljeet Kaur, has been falsely roped in for abetting the latter's suicide which admittedly took place in her own parental home. Still further submits that petitioner-Jaspal Singh and Gurdip Singh are the husbands of the sisters-in-law of the deceased while petitioner-Kuldeep Kaur is the married sister-in-law of the deceased and could not be held responsible for abetting the suicide of Kamaljeet Kaur as prior to the occurrence in question there had never been any complaint made by the complainant against the in-laws family much less against the petitioners of subjecting the deceased to any harassment, mental or physical. Still further, it has been submitted that totally vague allegations had been levelled that when the entire in-laws family including the petitioners visited the house of the complainant while the deceased was there subsequent to the delivery of her daughter, they abused and insulted her and on account of the humiliation she hanged herself to death after 08 days of such incident. It is further submitted that Ranjit Kaur, co-accused of the petitioners, has been extended the concession of interim bail by this court vide order dated 15.06.2021 in CRM-M-23100-2021 (Annexure P-4).

Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that that pursuant to orders dated 12.07.2021 and 14.07.2021, passed by this Court, the petitioners have joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from SI Dharam Pal, has conceded that the petitioners have joined investigation and their

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custodial interrogation is not required.

In view of the above, the petitions are allowed and interim orders dated 12.07.2021 and 14.07.2021, are made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.
