The instant petition is for quashing of FIR No.30, dated 08.02.2019, lodged under Sections 323, 406, 468-A and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 registered at Police Station Women, Panipat, District Panipat and the consequential proceedings arising out of the same, on the basis of compromise affidavit (Annexure P-2) arrived at, between the parties.

Vide order dated 15.07.2021 of this Court, the parties were directed to appear before the learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate on 16.08.2021 to get their statements recorded regarding the compromise arrived at, between them.

Report has since been received from learned Judicial Magistrate, Ist Class, Panipat in pursuance to the direction of this Court, wherein, the factum of the compromise arrived at between the

parties stands verified and confirmed. As per the report compromise has indeed been effected between the parties and the same is without any pressure or coercion and out of their free will and the complainant has also made statement to the effect that she would have no objection if the FIR *qua* the accused-petitioners is quashed.

The trial Court has annexed copies of statements of the parties alongwith its report.

Learned counsel for the parties have apprised the Court that the marriage between the parties also stands dissolved under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.

Learned State counsel too submits that there are no other accused other than the petitioners and respondent No.2 is the only aggrieved person in the FIR in question.

In view of the report of the learned Judicial Magistrate, Ist Class, Panipat and the principles laid down by the Apex Court in ***Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and others (2012) 10 SCC 303***, and also by the Full Bench of this Court in ***Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab and another, 2007(3) RCR (Criminal) 1052***, the instant petition is allowed. The aforesaid FIR and all consequential proceedings arising out of it, are quashed.

Needless to say the parties shall remain bound by the terms of compromise and their statements recorded before the Court below.
