This is a petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in FIR No. 0322 dated 24.04.2021 under Sections 120-B, 420, 467, 468, 471 and 506 of the IPC, registered at Police Station Sector-7, Faridabad, District Faridabad, Haryana.

At the very outset, without reference to the facts of the case, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that now the matter has been settled as the petitioners and the complainant are the real brothers and they have amicable settled their dispute. It is also submitted that the dispute was primarily arising out of their business which has been settled.

Mr. Anmol Malik, DAG, Haryana assisted by Mr. J. S. Bedi, Sr. Advocate with Mr. Sunil Sihag, Advocate for the complainant does not dispute that the matter has been compromised.

It is also worth noticing that the petitioners have also filed CRM-M-35249-2021 praying for quashing of the FIR on the basis of compromise, in which notice has been issued for recording the statement.

Accordingly, the present petition is allowed and the petitioners are granted the concession of anticipatory bail, subject to the conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

However, it will be open for the Investigating Officer to call upon the petitioners to join investigation, if so required, by issuing them a written notice in this regard.
